The proceedings commenced with a few entroductory remarks from The Chairman who stated that the meeting had been called with The veew of framing a code of Football Rules to be baled upon the Jugby system of play, but before desculsing this subject, it would be receiblary to form a Football Society of the Clubb present -

The first Resolution was then proposed by Mr. Folickes (Blackheart Club)

That in the opinion of this meeting the formation of a Rugby tootball Society is desirable : that such a society be formed for hwith and that the co-operation of all black be inveted - This was beconded by Mr. E. Rutter (Richmond Club) and carried unanimously-

It was then proposed by M. a. G. Guillemand (West Kent) and Seconded by M. M. F. balon (Reventcourt), and carried unanimously That the Society be called the "Rugery Football Union".

The Chairman then debmitted a dreft of rules for the working of the Union, and, after due discussion the following were decided

That the name of the Society be The Rugby Football Union I

That the Officers consists of a President . Honorary Scretary, and Treasurer , and a Committee of 13, who shall be elected Annuelly . Seven to form a quorum - with power to add to their number . 2. That all Clubs willing to conform to the rules of the "Union" be eligible for Membership -

4" That the annual Subscription of each Club be 5%mach year on admission)

1. That each blub be permitted to send two representatives to a s General Meeting, exclusive of the Officers of the Union"

1the That the Hon decretary be empowered to convene a special Seneral meeting at any time . on receiving a requisition to that effect , ligned by the decretaries of not less than five blubs .

8 - That no Rule shall be altered resended in added, without the consent of a majority of two thirds of the representations present, at a General Meeting -

10: That due notice of the proposal at any general meeting. of any alterations in the Rules (either of the Union, or of the game) be given to the Hon. Secretary, and that such proposed alterations be duly advertised. fourteen days before such general Meeting -

5the That a General Meeting be held annually in the Month of Octobers

9. That each Club be furnished with a copy of the Rules and be bound thereby, and in case of wilful infringement of such rules by any Club. Such Club be leable to expulsion from the Union at a General meeting

It was proposed by W. F. Luscombe (Supsies) and Seconded by the F. Stokes that these tales for the working of the Union he revised by the Committee before being published . Carried -

The election of the officers was then proceeded with, and The Stokes (Blackheath) proposed and Mr. Leigh (Ravenscourt) Seconded, "That The algernon Rutter be asked to accept the Office of President - Carried -

W. Edwin H. ash was requested to act as Hon- Secretary and Theaturer , which he contented to do for a time -
